

K9 KUP RULES & LEVELS

Untitled:	Dog (or junior handler) does not hold any AAC titles.
More than 3 years at K9Kup:	Dog (or junior handler) that has previously been at competitor in K9 Kup for more than three seasons will be scored as equivalent to having an ADC title.
AAC Title:	Only one dog (or junior handler) will be counted in the top three scores used to calculate team standings, with only one dog having an ADC title or equivalent.
Regular Class:	Suitable for inexperienced dogs and handlers. Standard Course Time (SCT) is that of AAC Starters level. Dogs compete at normal jump heights as specified by AAC rules. If you want your dog to jump one or two jump heights lower select "Special Class"
Special Class:	Dogs competing one or two jump heights lower than their normal height. The spread, broad and double jumps are not included and the A-Frame will be set at 5' only. Wall jumps will be used if present. Standard Course Time "SCT" will be the same as the Regular Class.
Veteran Class:	Dogs 5 years or older competing one or two jump heights lower than their normal height. The spread, broad and double jumps are not included and the A-Frame will be set at 5' only. Wall jumps/tires will be used if present. Standard Course time "SCT" will be greater than the Regular Class.
Running on Leash	Is not permitted.
Entry Restrictions:	K9 Kup will be restricted to 18 teams of a maximum of 8 dogs per team. P4FA must receive full payment and registration forms from a minimum of 6 team members for the team to be registered. Full payment for all members must be received by the specified date or the team status may be rescinded. A notice will be posted on the P4FA website and on the Paws4Fun Agility Club's K9 Kup Facebook group once the maximum number of teams has been reached. Applications received after that time may be placed on teams with empty spots if any and the applicant(s) notified.
Notes:	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><i>1. Dogs with 2 or more Advanced Standard Qs at time of registration are no longer able to compete in the K9Kup unless run by a Junior Handler.</i><i>2. Dogs obtaining any titles must notify organizer of title.</i><i>3. Recommended minimum age for dogs is 12 months. A handler may enter a younger dog at their own risk. It is strongly recommend that they use a lower jump height.</i><i>4. Rules used generally follow the Agility Association of Canada (AAC) and can be found online at www.aac.ca</i><i>5. Bitches in season are prohibited.</i>
